We now have further details of the Service of Thanksgiving to be held at Westminster Abbey at 12noon to 1pm on Tuesday 6th October 2015 and it gives me great pleasure to extend an invitation to all our members to attend, together with a guest. This will be a most meaningful event, and a very fitting way for us both to reflect on the extraordinary achievements of those who have gone before, and to prepare for the important work still to do.

Space is inevitably more limited at Westminster Abbey than at the Palace, and we are unable to guarantee every member a place. Therefore we will allocate places to members and their guests as applications are received, creating a Reserve List as necessary. It is hoped that we will be able to give members confirmation or otherwise of their place by mid August.

Once again, given the high profile and importance of this event and for security reasons, there is a formal application process that you will need to follow in order to attend. I would be most grateful if you could complete and return the enclosed application form to us by Tuesday 30th June in the freepost envelope provided addressed to Blind Veterans UK, 12 - 14 Harcourt Street, London W1H 4HD. The person accompanying you can be your wife/husband/partner, a family member, friend, escort, guide or carer. However this person's name cannot be changed at a later date so please choose someone who will definitely be available to accompany you on the day. Names on the application form must exactly match your chosen form of ID such as your passport, bus pass, disabled parking blue badge or Blind Veterans UK ID card that you should bring with you. As this is a special service for our members and those who have close association with the charity your invitation is non transferable.

Members and guests are requested to make their own arrangements for transport and accommodation. If you intend to come to London by train, please take a taxi on arrival from your London station or hotel to Westminster Abbey. Coaches will be provided at the end of the Service of Thanksgiving to take attendees to London mainline train stations.

Further information will be made available, in due course, on the Blind Veterans UK website and in The Review magazine.

Veterans Oyster photocard.

If you receive payments under the War Pensions Scheme, or Guaranteed Income Payment under the Armed Forces Compensation Schemes, you may be eligible for concessionary travel. With a Veterans Oyster photocard you can travel free on bus, tube, tram, DLR, London Overground, and most National Rail services in London.

You may be eligible for a Veterans Oyster photocard if you are:

In receipt of ongoing payments in your name under the War Pensions Scheme or income payment under the Armed Forces Compensation Scheme, again in your name. This includes widows, widowers and dependants.

Ongoing payments are awarded to Service personnel who have sustained a certain level of physical or psychological injury in the line of duty. If you received a one-off gratuity payment instead of ongoing payments, then you're not eligible for a Veterans Oyster photocard.

You can also travel on some National Rail services in London:

Chiltern Railway services between Amersham and Marylebone, West Ruislip and South Ruislip. Great Northern services between Finsbury Park and King's Cross. Thameslink services between West Hampstead Thameslink and Elephant & Castle. London Midland services between Harrow & Wealdstone and Euston. Greater Anglia services between Stratford and Liverpool Street. c2c services between Upminster and Fenchurch Street. You can travel free from 09:30 on weekdays and any time on weekends and public holidays on most other National Rail services in London and services to Dartford and Swanley.

Well done to our 2015 London Marathon runners. By Catherine Goodier, Review Editor.

They trained all year, running in all weathers, at all hours and through injuries. On Sunday 26th April it was their time to show the world that their dedication had paid off and that they were a formidable force. Kelly Hart, Paul Jacobs GM, Andy Leitch, Alan Lock, Charlie Parkinson and Steve Parnell lined up at the start in Greenwich with their running partners to take on the challenge of the Virgin Money London Marathon 2015.

Alan Lock was the first past the post with his guide in just 3 hours and 25 minutes. They were so fast that I only just caught them as they sprinted past.

Second past the post was Charlie Parkinson with his running partner Bob Hind, a volunteer in the Sports & Rec department at the Llandudno centre. They crossed the finish line in 4 hours and 8 minutes, a personal best as they shaved 29 minutes off their 2014 time.

This was Charlie's second London Marathon with Bob, and as they ran along The Mall and towards the finish line they did their trademark victory salute, with arms raised they sprinted to cross their own personal Rubicon. Charlie is presently training to run the 100k in our London to Brighton walk or run challenge in June.

In third was Kelly Ganfield running with Richard Wilkins. Kelly said: "The day started well when I met the inspirational Rob Young, who is now better known as the Marathon Man, as he has run 370 marathons in 365 days.

"I was thrilled to achieve a personal best of 4 hours and 21 seconds in this year's London marathon and as I ran I thought of the late Colwyn Lloyd and so many of the great veterans I've met; as this marathon was also for them. I have to thank Russell Scullion and Craig Brindley in the Sports & Rec Dept at the Brighton centre as just a few days before the London marathon my running partner pulled out. Thankfully they set me up with Richard who usually runs a marathon in around three hours, and it was thanks to them and to him that I achieved a personal best. The cheers from the crowd kept me going and for me the best part was finding that extra reserve to sprint to the finish line!"

Running with Darren Scullion, Andy Leitch completed the marathon in 5 hours and 45 minutes.

Andy said: "It was a good experience and although I enjoyed it this is the last time I will run a marathon! I'm glad I ran the London marathon in our centenary year as it adds to the sense of achievement."

Running on an injury Steve Parnell showed strength of character and sheer determination of will as he finished the marathon in 6 hours and 30 minutes with his running guide David Babbister, whom he had also completed the Great South Run and the Eaton Dorney Triathlon with.

Congratulations must go to all of our runners and guides and thanks too for their fundraising, as they each raised money and awareness for Blind Veterans UK. Within 48 hours of the Daily Telegraph's feature on Paul Jacobs GM he had raised over £4,000, an astonishing sum in such a short time.

Blind Veterans UK Bowmen, formerly St Dunstan's, Indoor Shoot. Saturday 7th to Friday 13th March 2015. By Graham Walker.

On Friday 6th March Blind Veterans UK Archers made their way to the Brighton centre from across the country to take part in their first club shoot of the season. Friendships were immediately renewed and banter recommenced that continued until the last archer departed from the Brighton centre at the end of the event. Everyone arrived ready for a full week of coaching, shooting and socialising. The event took place in the Sports Hall at the Brighton centre. Owing to the size of the hall the archers were split into two groups, one shot in the morning, the other in the afternoon.

Saturday 7th March.

Archers spent the day in a coaching and practice session. Unfortunately due to illness, some of the coaches were unable to be there with us. However, Sue Habgood did a grand job guiding us through the session.

Sunday 8th March.

A team was selected from Blind Veterans UK Bowmen to take part in a competition against Hellingly Archery Club. A Portsmouth round was shot, which means archers would shoot one set of five dozen arrows on a 60cm face at 20 yards. The outcome of the competition resulted in a win for Blind Veterans UK Bowmen.

Members of the winning team were John Cunnington, Peter Price, Carole Sharpe and Carol Davies.

Unfortunately the University of Southampton had to cancel their afternoon match against us. However, as some of the archers from Hellingly Archery Club stayed behind to shoot again with archers who did not have the opportunity to shoot in the morning competition everyone was happy.

Monday 9th March.

Blind Veterans UK Bowmen shot a Worcester round, which is a set of five dozen arrows at 20 yards. The round is shot on two special 16 inch faces, one above the other.

Competition results: First place Paul Palmer, Second place John Cunnington and in Third place David Poyner.

Our Annual General Meeting was held in the late afternoon, when the Gaygan Gold Trophy was awarded to Peter Price. This trophy is awarded every year to the archer who shoots the most arrows into the gold during the club's season at the Brighton centre. John Cunnington was awarded the Archery GB Handicap Improvers Medal for the greatest reduction in handicap throughout the 2014 outdoor season. Many congratulations to both archers for their achievements.

Tuesday 10th March.

Once again a Portsmouth round was shot, this time between the Blind Veterans UK Bowmen for the Longhill Trophy. The Winner was Carol Davies, the Runner-up was John Cunnington, followed by Peter Price in Third place.

Wednesday 11th March.

We shot the 'World Archery Visually Impaired Indoor' competition, or, as in most things, abbreviated to WAVI indoor. The winner of this round was Robert Harvey, in Second place Kelvin Platt, followed by Tom Roddy in Third place.

Thursday 12th March.

The club shoot today was a FITA 25, which is one set of five dozen arrows shot on a 60cm face at 25 metres. This inter club competition was shot for the Laurie Austin Trophy. The winner was Tom Roddy, in Second place Dennis Murphy, followed by Kelvin Platt in Third place.

In the evening we took on Ditchling Archery Club shooting the FITA 25 round. It was very close, however Blind Veterans UK Bowmen eventually won by 94 points. The winning team members were Paul Palmer, David Poyner, Tom Roddy and Carol Davies.

Friday 13th March.

The FITA 18 was our last shoot of the week. This round consists of one set of five dozen arrows shot on a 40cm face at 18 metres. The winner was Dennis Murphy,

in Second place Tom Roddy, followed by Robert Harvey in Third place.

The archer's scores from the 18 and 25 metre FITA'S were then added together to make a combined FITA for the Marjorie Scott Shield which was won by Dennis Murphy, followed by Tom Roddy in Second place, with Paul Palmer taking Third place.

Friday night found us in the Blue Room where the cups and medals were presented by Babs Muggridge, our Lady P for the evening, to the lucky winners of the week's first shoot of the season.

After an absence of 10 years it was great to welcome back Tom Roddy and what a successful week he had. Robert Harvey had a good result on his first Archery Week, as did Dennis Murphy on his first indoor competition. Very many congratulations to you all.

Our next event will have taken place by the time this article is in the Review, as we will have held an event from Monday 25th May, during which we have a very special shoot arranged to celebrate Blind Veterans UK Centenary.

Last, but by no means least, we would like to thank all of our coaches, spotters, helpers and family members for their continued support and assistance. They give up their time freely to ensure our continued participation in the sport. On behalf of the archers, thank you.

Blind Veterans UK G.O.A.L. Group Celebrates our charity's centenary at the Union Jack Club in London. By Carol Davies.

Since our charity's inception in 1915, Blind Veterans UK has given their members the help, support and tools to lead constructive independent lives. So in this, Blind Veterans UK's centennial year, in tribute and with the ethos of the charity in mind the G.O.A.L. Group undertook their biggest challenge to date.

We held an event in London that was independent of both staff and volunteers. On Monday 2nd March 2015, 10 members of the G.O.A.L. Group made their way from all corners of the land via public transport to the Union Jack Club in London, our base for the week. Members who attended were Carol Davies, Chris Humphrey, Lindy Elliot, Carol Sadler, Wendy Kane, Diane Mountford, Peter King, David Hazelgrove, Graham Walker and John Cantwell.

We settled into our rooms before meeting for coffee to discuss the week's itinerary. Later that evening we dined at the Union Jack Club before making our way to the Shaftsbury Theatre to a performance of the musical Memphis. On arrival we were shown to our seats by the theatre staff with the promise that during the interval they would return to see if we required anything. I have to say, well done Shaftsbury Theatre staff for your excellent service. The show was wonderful and enjoyed by all, although one member, Graham Walker, commented "I wasn't sure I would enjoy it but I was pleasantly surprised".

After the show we were guided to the exit where taxis were hailed to take us back to the hotel. We had an early start the following day, so had a quick nightcap in the bar before retiring. Wendy Kane was most dismayed at the early start and told us she was not exactly a morning person, I have to say she did an excellent job of disguising this!

Tuesday 3rd March.

After an early breakfast we made our way to the tube where assistance was requested for our party of 10. It was highly amusing to hear the incredulity in the voices of the tube staff as they repeated the request. We were guided to the platform and on to the tube. I'm sure we must have created quite a stir. It's not every day such a large group of vision impaired people traverse the London underground. We were met at Westminster by another member of the underground staff who was a little overwhelmed by our number but coped admirably and took us to the entrance we needed for our tour of Parliament.

Our guide left us with a promise to inform his boss we would be travelling back via tube later that day.

For our tour of Parliament we were split into two groups of five. The tour covered the House of Commons, House of Lords and the Robing Rooms. The guides were very knowledgeable and regaled us with a comprehensive history of the building. Lindy Elliot mentioned to the guide that she lived in the same village as Black Rod and it was suggested that Lindy ring Black Rod's PA to see if he was available to meet with us. We were all very surprised when Black Rod agreed to meet us at 11am and all equally disappointed when, due to a pressing engagement, he had to cancel.

After our event Lindy attended church and Black Rod sat down beside her, she explained that we had hoped to meet him during our tour of Parliament. He was very apologetic that his meeting that day had over run. After helping her to the church alter and back Lindy told him they were obviously meant to meet that day. He was, according to Lindy, absolutely charming and wanted to know more about Blind Veterans UK.

Leaving Parliament we decided to have lunch before continuing with our itinerary. You would imagine finding a lunch venue in London would be relatively easy, not so. However, after the first two choices had been declined by group members for various reasons, as in the story of The Three Bears the third was fine with all. This was to set the scene for all restaurant choices for the week.

After lunch we made our way to the meeting point for the Duck Tour and climbed aboard our amphibious vehicle. Having originally been used in the Second World War the Duck had been rebuilt and modified to meet the stringent safety regulations set by the road and river authorities.

We set off on a 45 minute road based tour which encompassed the London Eye, Houses of Parliament, Westminster Abbey, 10 Downing Street, Horse Guard's Parade, Trafalgar Square (a tribute to Britain's greatest mariner) and Buckingham Palace where many blind veterans would attend a garden party to celebrate the charity's centenary. The second of our high profile centenary celebrations is the Service of Thanksgiving at Westminster Abbey on 6th October.

Our guide also pointed out Tate Britain at Millbank and the MI5 and MI6 buildings. At this point our land based tour ended and we had a change of driver, someone qualified to take the Duck onto the Thames.

The Duck on the Thames tour was interesting and very different; the guide was informative although his jokes were extremely corny. Every time we passed another Duck the guide insisted we quack and of course we complied. For the rest of the week any sighting of a Duck, and believe you me even a blind veteran would have trouble missing the huge yellow amphibious vehicle, would have the whole group quacking excitedly!

Wednesday 4th March.

Our day began with another production of Blind Veterans UK 'Carry On, on The Underground'. After requesting assistance we were all following our guide to the platform when someone asked for a tissue, a tissue was searched for and produced. Unfortunately, during the tissue hunt, our guide had continued on, leaving seven of our party behind. We decided to stay where we were until the guide realised his group was somewhat depleted and returned for us. We were all amused to think of the ribbing the guide would receive from his colleagues should they find out he had misplaced seven vision impaired passengers.

Our destination today was Blind Veterans UK's head office. We were met at Harcourt Street by Rob Baker, Blind Veterans UK Archivist, and his volunteers Sue Boyle and Eugenia Volkonskaia. Rob showed us to the Council Room where he gave a very interesting talk about the charity's history, after which we were split into two groups for our tour. We were shown to the basement where old records, including the 1915 to 1921 Minute Book, are archived. The Minute Book logged decisions taken by, what was initially the Blinded Soldiers and Sailors Care Committee. There were also early photographs from the First World War and beyond which had been donated by families of the VADs (nurses from the Volunteer Aid Detachment) along with such equipment as type writers and Braille machines that were used by the original members of our charity. They also have a great deal of craft work created by early members, paintings and woodwork.

Whilst one group was looking around the Archives, the other stayed with the volunteers chatting about the charity and their personal experiences. After our tour with Rob we all made our way to the dining room where lunch was provided. Blind Veterans UK's new Chief Executive, Major General (Rtd) Nick Caplin CB came and joined us before he had to dash to Scotland to attend a Blind Veterans UK Reunion.

As we were lucky to have been given complimentary tickets for the London Eye we took our leave of Rob Baker and all at Blind Veterans UK's head office and headed for our destination. On arrival at the London Eye we were fast tracked into a pod to enjoy our 'flight'.

After a busy but enjoyable day we made our way back to the Union Jack Club to relax before enjoying dinner and a few drinks.

Thursday 5th March.

Ship Ahoy! Today we visited HMS Belfast and a wonderful time was had by all. We arrived on board and were met by our guides who began our visit with a tactile session that included trying on navel uniforms. We were then split into two groups and fitted with hard hats for safety. Our guides gave us a detailed history of the ship, explaining that Harland and Wolff built HMS Belfast in 1936 and she was launched on St Patrick's Day by Anne Chamberlain, the wife of Neville Chamberlain, Prime Minister of the day. It was commissioned into the Navy on the 5th August 1939. HMS Belfast patrolled the northern waters, imposing a maritime blockade on Germany. After only two months at sea HMS Belfast struck a magnetic mine and was out of action for three years, rejoining the home fleet in 1942. After WWII HMS Belfast was actively involved in the Korean War from 1950 to 1952. The ship spent her final years performing peace keeping duties until decommissioned in 1963.

The Imperial War Museum investigated the possibility of preserving a WWII War Cruiser. This led to the formation of a trust by one of the ship's former Captains, Sir Morgan Morgan-Giles. HMS Belfast was finally brought to London and opened to the public on Trafalgar Day, October 21st 1971. One of the largest and most powerful light cruisers ever built, she is the last vessel of her type.

After thanking our guides we departed HMS Belfast and made our way for lunch.

As it was our last evening we decided to eat out rather than at the hotel. The group plumped for an Italian restaurant only a stone's throw from the Union Jack Club. The food was very tasty and the staff helpful and friendly. Of course the final stop of the night was the Union Jack Club's bar where we had our final nightcap.

Friday 6th March.

After breakfast it was time for us all to take our leave of one another as everyone, with the exception of me and Graham Walker, headed home. Graham and I went on to the Brighton centre to enjoy a week of Archery with Blind Veterans UK Bowmen.

Wendy Kane's Story.

Wendy was previously a member of Blind Veterans UK's Younger Group until she reached the age limit of 60 and had to leave. Having made many friends within the group and having enjoyed the many activities that included rock climbing and white water rafting, Wendy was left feeling isolated. She felt a big chunk of her social and emotional support was no longer available to her.

Wendy was asked many times to join the G.O.A.L. Group but resisted; as she imagined a bunch of OAPs sitting around playing dominoes or rocking in chairs. She felt the fun, laughter and activities she had enjoyed with the younger veterans would not be replicated in the G.O.A.L. Group.

Wendy had a serious operation which took its toll and resulted in her becoming reclusive. It was thanks to a member of G.O.A.L. who finally persuaded her to join the group. After booking to take part in the London G.O.A.L. event Wendy began her journey with more than a little trepidation. Having wholeheartedly thrown herself into the week's activities she realised her perception of the group as a bunch of fuddy duddy OAP's could not have been further from the truth.

She said: "They were a brilliant gang who restored my sanity and welcomed me with open arms. I have not laughed so much in ages." Wendy enjoyed the event so much she has already signed up for the Llandudno G.O.A.L. event in October.

Founder's Day 2015.

On 25th March 2015 we celebrated a landmark in our centenary year. It was the day that 100 years earlier our founder Sir Arthur Pearson Bt, GBE moved our work from Bayswater Hill to our First World War training centre in London's Regent's Park to continue his visionary and groundbreaking work with the first 16 war blinded members of our charity. It was also the day that we celebrated our 2015 Founder's Day Awards at the Llandudno centre.

In the May edition of the Review we brought you news of blind veterans John Cantwell, Graham Ward, Derek O'Rourke, Peter King, Dennis Sarginson and Alan Walker who had each won a Founder's Day Award, and Frank Tinsley who was awarded the Ted Higgs Trophy.

Four volunteers to receive Founder's Day Awards in recognition of their outstanding work were Graham Reed, Pam Bar, Marion Rees and Dawn Wafer. Anne Radcliffe Welfare Support Officer, Viccie Beech Regional Fundraiser Llandudno, Mike Crawford Acting Technical Support Manager (Brighton) and Kathryn Jones-Romaine Art & Craft Instructor (Brighton), each received a Chairman's Commendation Award as they went above and beyond what was expected of them in their roles with Blind Veterans UK.

Ed Rees, winner of the Founder's Day Innovator of the Year Award.

The Innovator of the Year Founder's Day Award was given to Ed Rees in recognition of his work on the Babblebox.

"Throughout our 100 years we have been innovators. We were one of the first organisations to train people in the UK to use the white canes that are used today. The late Lord Fraser, who was our Chairman for 53 years, set up a technology department nearly 70 years ago which developed all kinds of equipment that was suitable for people with multi disabilities, particularly our blind and handless veterans. Our Archives contain many photographs that show engineering solutions to problems.

"Tommy Gaygan played the trombone, and Tommy Gaygan had no hands from the elbow downwards, but with specially designed gauntlets he played a trombone to a very high standard and was in the brass section of our band at Church Stretton. He's just one of many examples.

"But this award is given to a person or organisation who has successfully introduced to Blind Veterans UK beneficial advice or an idea for use by our members.

"The use of computer technology has been a liberating experience for many of our members. For some it has become an essential skill and a huge step towards independence. However for people with vision loss touch typing is a fundamental part of the learning process and it can be very daunting.

"Two years ago one of our IT Managers, Matt Lee, who works at the Llandudno centre took on the task of developing the new device to replace the Aesop talking keyboard, which had been in use for many years, but which had become increasingly antiquated and difficult to source. Coupled with the New Zealand twang to the voice that was in the device it led to difficulties in understanding while trying to learn basic typing skills.

"Matt produced a device based upon a mini computer called a Raspberry Pi. It looked a bit Heath Robinson to begin with but it was remarkably effective. After much variation in development it eventually resulted in today's Babblebox.

"The Babblebox is about the size of a paperback book. The refinement however of the prototype into a working usable everyday device, matching the original

vision that Matt had and the subsequent team development, which was contributed to hugely by a lot of people within our IT service, was undertaken by Ed Rees, an engineer who has his own company based in Maidenhead.

"While Blind Veterans UK has paid for the components Ed has undertaken the detailed manufacture of the Babblebox at very low cost and in much of his own time. We now have 50 Babbleboxes in use since August 2014.

"Our IT instructors use the device to loan them out to members and they are able to practice typing and the feedback from users has been outstanding. The whole project has been an example of teamwork and resourcefulness. Ed Rees has been pivotal for bringing the whole process together. Not only to produce a working device, but one that we're proud to put our name to.

"In working for us, much of which is for free, he has shown the meaning of charitable giving and we believe that he thoroughly deserves the Innovator of the Year Award."

So you really are doing tremendous work and I congratulate all the winners today and please accept my individual congratulations.

"I would also like to thank the staff. Whether that person is sitting behind a desk in Harcourt Street, whether they're working at our centres, whether they're members of the field staff, as they are all patient, they are experienced, they are dedicated, and they work hard on our behalf. I would say how lucky we are to have such wonderful staff and long may they stay with us.

"The achievements of our volunteers have already been spoken of, as they add a new dimension, and I would say that of course they do help the organisation to take in and spread the service to far more people and surely that can't be a bad thing. So on behalf of all blind veterans right across the country can I say to all members of staff thank you for all that you do for us acting as our safety net should we fall.

"And finally I want to thank Mark Lovatt, the Llandudno centre manager, and all the staff here at the Llandudno centre. They have made a special day more special by the ability of their organisation as it has run extremely smoothly. Please receive our grateful thanks for all that you do, not just today, but throughout the year and you know how popular this centre is.

"So ladies and gentlemen it's been a great day and thank you for attending and again a special thank you to Jane Keane, the Llandudno Centre Administrator, and everyone involved in organising this."

Spring Photography Week at the Brighton centre. By Keith Harness.

As Ansel Adams once quoted "Photography is more than a medium for factual communication of ideas. It is a creative art."

The Spring Photography Week ran from 5th to 11th April at the Brighton centre. During the course of the afternoon of the 5th the members who had signed up to take part in the photography themed week began to arrive in Brighton. Not only were they eager to start the week's activities, but also to discuss their recent achievements with fellow members who share a common interest in photography.

The photographers were Mark Threadgold, Ray Munday, Mark Pile, Will Phillips, John English, John Pullinger, Chris Nowell and Bob Beck.

The week began with an informal session when we introduced ourselves and spoke of the cameras we would use and about our main photographic interests. Throughout the group these ranged from landscape photography to capturing images of grandchildren, street photography, taking macro close ups and portraits. In total an expansive area of expertise and a wide photographic range.

Following on from the morning break we split up into several small groups, as we took part in the first of the week's photographic exercises when we searched for items that ranged in colour, shape, texture and size. Though many were easily found others allowed us to be more creative.

Following lunch we set out on our first field trip of the week it was to the North Lanes area in Brighton as it afforded us the opportunity to use different photographic techniques, whilst capturing images of people, their surroundings and examples of street art. There were images of an array of vibrant scenes that showed in-depth detailing on buildings in several of the side streets. As we passed through narrow side streets we came across a number of street performers who were captivating and entertaining passersby and we stopped to photograph them as it afforded us an ideal opportunity to capture images of people and their emotions. Being in our groups, which were led by Esther Freeman Member Activities Manager, Craig Brindley Rehabilitation & Training Support Supervisor (Brighton) and Natasha Cartwright, who organises many activities at the Brighton centre, meant that we could head in different directions as we took in a variety of scenes to capture the perfect image.

On Tuesday we departed for the day's field trip when our groups were to be led by Esther, Caroline and Dominika. Our groups were changed slightly as this gave us the chance to work with other people.

Our first stop of the day took us to the Redoubt Fortress in Eastbourne, where we could take in some of the period details found within the Fortress and the expansive views along the coastline and nearby houses. Many of us started to selectively capture images of the period details, including the canons, their supports, fixtures and wooden doorways, whilst others began photographing the expansive views and looking down into the fortress's inner circle and features. We took part in a guided tour of the fortress's museum, where we were able to take in the large array of military memorabilia that dated back throughout the fortresses' history, whilst at the same time learning about the background behind each of these different displays.

Though the interior of the museum was dark, and therefore not ideal for most cameras, some of the group still managed to capture images of the many artefacts on display and the features found within the confinements of the fortress. Back outside we continued to capture images within the grounds, taking in many of the smaller period details and stairways as we did so.

Back on the bus we continued our way along the coast to the South Downs national park where we intended for us to look at different landscape scenes, however unfortunately due the weather, with a low lying mist across the area, we were left with limited views of the surrounding countryside and coast line. Whilst some groups tried to make the most of the seascape scenes we chose to look at the surrounding countryside features before returning to the Brighton centre.

In the afternoon we continued with our next photographic exercise; capturing still life macro (close up) images of several different floral and still life subjects. These were arranged as displays or as single items giving us the option to capture the flowers within a specific colour combination, or singularly against a black background; giving us the immediate contrast between light and dark whilst at the same time enhancing their vibrant colours and shape.

Wednesday saw most of us continue to capture a variety of different close up; floral images, taken both from a distance and closer up as we concentrated on

the details that are found in the flower heads. Following on from the morning break we moved on to portraiture. Looking firstly at how to place subjects before the camera, whilst at the same time making them feel more at ease and looking their best, we started to capture a selection of images, taken of each other whilst at the same time looking at a variety of posing and lighting techniques within a small studio environment. Thanks to a basic studio set up using just a single flash and reflector, each giving us the opportunity to capture a selection of evenly lit portraits, or those with a low key effect, showing only a limited amount of light, as it falls along the outline of the subject's face, giving the subject an overall darker, much older, worn appearance.

After lunch visiting photographer Catherine Bensen, who had kindly agreed to visit the group during the afternoon, shared her experiences of time spent working at the Guardian, along with a brief insight into her past achievements and experiences before moving on to different portrait techniques. To demonstrate a selection of these we moved outside to the courtyard area for a working discussion to use different outdoor lighting conditions to our advantage to add fill flash to enhance areas of the face in shadow. We took it in turn to capture images of John, a member who was there to take part in the 100k training week, as he agreed to model for us during our practice session. This left Catherine free to pass on tips as she moved through the group and spoke of how best to light the subject whilst taking advantage of their surroundings. She spoke of the different ways depth of field can be used to enhance the image, using either a large aperture or simply using natural features to lead the viewer to a particular area of the scene.

Thursday morning began with a short discussion of the day's forthcoming activities in Hastings. On arrival we headed for the West Cliff area and boarded the funicular railway that took us to the castle. We were disappointed after briefly looking around, as it seemed at first that the mist was starting to clear at lower levels, but the view from the cliff top along the coastline and castle were still restricted, making it hard to capture the spectacular coastal views. We made our way back to the base of the cliffs and headed firstly for a fish and chip meal before dividing into our groups to head off and explore and capture images of the area.

Whilst some went off to wander amongst the narrow boutique lined streets of the old town a group of us set off along the promenade in search of an area used on a daily basis by the fisherman. As we approached this area the

tall wooden clad buildings and huts could be seen from a distance and as we walked amongst them we were able to capture a wide variety of images of the fisherman's catch, their daily life and their equipment. With small huts lining the streets that were used to fillet and sell fresh fish, dry nets and storage units. These led to an area of the beach used by the fisherman to launch their small boats into the water and store unwanted old machinery. It was whilst walking amongst these pieces of old machinery that I had ample opportunity to capture a large variety of images that ranged from close ups of the old machinery to abstract black and white shots that were captured against the sea mist.

The mist finally cleared just before our departure revealing the hillside properties as we looked along the coast and boats waiting to come ashore with their day's catch.

On Friday we took part in several different activities. Whilst some of the group captured abstract still life images using a variety of everyday items, others went through their images to select what they felt were their four favourite images of the week. These were printed and hung in a mini gallery for all to view. With the week coming to an end this was followed by a closing talk and feedback on the week's activities and our stay at the Brighton centre.

Throughout the photography week a great deal is packed into the time available, with member participation being an important factor as everyone works together to help each other where possible to achieve the perfect image. This was clear throughout the week with young helping old and the more experienced photographers helping those who were starting out.

A big thank you goes to Esther Freeman, Member Activities Manager, for putting the week together, along with the volunteers and staff who helped throughout the week to make it a great success.

Over a number of years the photography themed weeks have gone from strength to strength in several centres, proving to be a great success amongst members of all ages. This has led us to the conclusion that a Photography Club may be the way forward. Details of this will be released in due course; however in the meantime we would be grateful for any feedback.

An interview with Roger Williams. By Colin Williamson, Contributing Editor.

Roger Williams was born in Cardiff on 9th September 1946 and brought up in Barry, South Wales. His father and uncle were both miners, eking out a living from the South Wales coal fields that were rich with coal deposits.

Roger vividly remembers his father asking him to step into the front room of their Barry home when he was 15 years old and about to leave school. "You didn't go into the front room very often," says Roger. "It was the best room in the house and to be asked to step inside with your father often meant that you were in trouble!"

Roger wasn't about to be told off by his dad but instead asked to make a promise that he would never work underground. "I'd heard the stories about life in the pits so I told my dad not to worry and that a team of horses wouldn't be able to drag me down the shaft!" His father, pleased with the response, offered some advice. "Go for an apprenticeship; get a trade behind you, plumbing, bricklaying or electrician, anything like that and you'll always be in work. Even if things dry up you'll always be able to take on odd jobs here and there."

"I took my dad's advice and started an apprenticeship as a plumber with the local council. After six weeks I'd had enough so I left and started work with my brother in law in a sheet metal factory. As the new lad, I was given all of the menial jobs that nobody wanted. I soon got bored with that and after a few weeks I handed in my notice and went looking for something else. I knew what I wanted to do. When I was a young boy I had received a Meccano set for one of my birthdays and I really enjoyed building things with it. I was good with my hands and I was also interested in cars so I decided to look for work in a garage as a mechanic. I trudged around the garages in Barry asking if they needed an apprentice. The last garage but one asked if I'd be willing to have a week's trial to see if I had the aptitude to be a mechanic. I managed to get through the week and they took me on as an accelerated apprentice. I spent nearly four years with that garage and received my apprenticeship papers just weeks before they went bust so I got a trade but lost a job! After a fruitless search for work I decided to join the Forces. Steady job, good pay, a chance to travel and I'd get to work on vehicles. What more could I ask!

"Off I went to the recruiting offices in Cardiff with the intention of signing up for the RAF. My dad was ex-RAF so I thought I'd follow in his footsteps. After passing all the tests I asked about becoming an airframe fitter. 'No vacancies I'm afraid.' said the officer behind the desk. 'We're short of cooks and stewards though, that's all we have to offer at the moment I'm afraid'. Well, I didn't want any of that so I popped next door to the Army recruiting office and told them that the RAF didn't want me and did they have any vacancies. The chap sitting behind the desk told me they were looking for recruits for the Royal Artillery so I thought 'They've got big guns so they must have vehicles to tow them' so I took the tests, passed them with flying colours and signed on there and then!

"That was late 1964 and I reported for duty at Oswestry in January 1965. During my training I was persuaded by the instructors to go for the parachute arm of the Royal Artillery, the 7th Parachute Regiment. So after my 13 weeks initial training off I went to Aldershot to join the Paras; I passed the physical stuff and then moved on to jump school at Abingdon airfield where, after a series of static jumps from a balloon and progressing to jumping from an aircraft, I was eventually awarded my wings.

"After service with 7th Regiment I was posted to 5th Field Regiment R.A. which was stationed in Gutersloh, West Germany. The regiment were equipped with 25 pounders and 105 pack howitzers and were often out on exercise on the ranges around Soltau which after my time spent with the Para's got to be pretty boring and mundane. One day on regimental orders I saw a notice asking for volunteers to serve over in Oman teaching gunnery to the armed forces of the Sultanate of Salala. This sounded like my idea of fun and I put my name down and was accepted. I spent nine months over in Oman and loved it. After that it was back to Germany and another posting, this time to 4th Field Regiment based at Dennis Barracks in Munsterlager close to the East German border. During my time with the 4th I was sent to Malaysia and Borneo where I saw active service operating a Green Archer mortar locating radar. When we weren't operating the radar we were patrolling in the jungle which was a whole new experience and one that I relished. After completing my tour in Borneo I was posted back to the UK and the Royal Artillery depot in Woolwich to work in the Battery Quartermasters Stores (BQMS) and after that the Junior Leaders Regiment R.A. at Gamecock Barracks near Nuneaton in Warwickshire as an instructor with 33 Campbell Battery.

"Whilst with 33 Battery I was asked to consider a posting to Hong Kong, which I would have loved, but unfortunately as my wife had recently been diagnosed with cancer we couldn't go. Due to my wife's illness I decided to apply for discharge and I finally left the army in 1975. Not long after leaving the Forces my wife passed away.

"Back in Civvy Street I'd met a girl from Coventry so I settled down there and started work in a garage. It was just like serving my apprenticeship all over again. My days consisted of changing oil filters, tyres, exhausts, replacing clutches, brake pipes etc and I was beginning to get weary of it. I thought there must be something better than this! One night as I sat watching motor racing on the telly I saw the mechanics milling around in the pits and said to myself, these guys must be the best of the best, I'm going to see if I can get into that.

"I'd always been a petrol head [car enthusiast] and in my spare time I followed motor racing. One afternoon at a race circuit watching a Formula Ford race I saw a guy struggle to get his racing car off the trailer. I shouted over to ask if he needed a hand and when he replied in the affirmative I went over and got stuck in. As it turned out, he did everything by himself. He brought the car to the track, did all of his servicing and repairs and raced on the circuits. I started to help him on a regular basis. Because he had more time to concentrate on actually racing the car (I was doing most, if not all, of the preparation) he started to move from the back of the grid towards the front. This must have been noticed and I was approached by a guy from Formula Three and asked if I wanted to join their team which involved travelling around the country and being paid into the bargain! I stayed with them for a while and then moved on to Formula Two and instead of touring Britain I toured Europe; great stuff! Eventually I made it into Formula 1 and the Williams team. After a spell with Williams I moved on to McLaren and toured the world with them. In 1976 I was part of the team that won the constructors championship and our driver, James Hunt, won the World Championship by one point over Ferrari's defending champion Niki Lauda.

"My job in the team was right rear wheel, which meant changing the tyre to suit the conditions when the car stopped in the pits. It involved taking off the safety clip, undoing the nut, taking off the tyre, replacing it, putting the nut back on and finally replacing the safety clip. This was done in 4.8 seconds. Nowadays, it's done in 2.8 seconds but bear in mind there were only 10 of us in the pits and now there are 26! I loved every minute of Formula 1 and greatly admired the drivers, especially Ayrton Senna, James Hunt, Emerson Fittipaldi and Nigel Mansell. They were racers who went out to win, nowadays it's all about team tactics and big money, it's a business and nothing like the old days.

"Due to my failing eyesight, I retired from Formula 1 in 1990 and fortunately

Blind Veterans UK (then St Dunstan's) stepped in relatively quickly in 1993. I went down to the Brighton centre for a week's induction and at that stage I was still feeling a bit sorry for myself and going through the 'why me' stage. When I walked into the lounge I saw all of these First and Second World War veterans, some with no hands, missing limbs, half a face, sitting chatting and laughing, having a pint and a game of dominoes, I turned and walked out and cried my eyes out. That was the kick up the backside I needed. No more feeling sorry for myself Roger!

"I started up the Barry Lunch Club after chatting with my Welfare Officer Fiona Trolley; I hadn't attended any reunions because I didn't know any local Blind Veterans UK beneficiaries and thought what's the point of sitting there on my own when I can sit in the house! Fiona encouraged me to get out and meet some fellow veterans so I formed a lunch club and now we have 20 or so beneficiaries who come along every month and it's a real success story.

"Blind Veterans UK is without doubt, the best thing that has happened to me in a very, very long time!"

Joseph Ambrose of Chelmsford, Essex died on 19th April 2015, aged 83. He joined the Royal Artillery in 1950 serving at home and in the Far East, Singapore, Malaya, Hong Kong and Cyprus. He was discharged as a Gunner in 1965.

Frank Andrew of Lingfield, Surrey died on 26th April 2015, aged 98. He joined the Royal Army Service Corps in 1940. In November 1942 he was posted to North Africa and then fought in the Italian campaign before returning to the UK for discharge as a Private in 1946.

Derek Bannister of Leatherhead, Surrey died on 15th April 2015, aged 83. For National Service he served in the Royal Air Force from 1950 to 1952 when he then trained as a wireless operator at RAF Compton Bassett. Albert 'John' Green of St Albans, Hertfordshire died on 25th April 2015, aged 93. He joined the Royal Air Force in 1940. Qualified as aircrew he became a

wireless operator/gunner with Bomber Command and served in Europe, Egypt, North Africa and the Middle East. He flew in Halifaxes and Wellingtons and was discharged as a Warrant Officer in 1946.

Leslie 'Jim' Green of Clacton On Sea, Essex died on 27th April 2015, aged 83. He joined the Royal Navy in 1949 and served for seven years. He then had a two year break before rejoining for a further seven years and was later discharged as a Leading Electrical Mechanic in 1965.

Having decided to stay in the Army he took part in the Suez operation in 1956 before discharge in 1960.

John Johnston of Preston, Lancashire died on 12th April 2015, aged 88. In November 1944 he joined the Irish Guards and in October 1945 transferred to the Royal Engineers, serving in Sudan before discharge as a Staff Sergeant in 1948.

Ernest Leighton of Wirral, Merseyside died on 1st February 2015, aged 94. He was called up for Service in the Army in 1940, trained in Liverpool and joined the 8th Kings Regiment in Yorkshire before going to India in 1942. He played sport for the Regiment and fought with General Wingate's Chindits before returning home for discharge in Manchester as a CQMS in 1946.

Douglas Lofts of Bexhill on Sea, East Sussex died on 24th April 2015, aged 99. He joined the Corps of Military Police in Eastbourne in 1940 as a motor cyclist. He served in the UK until 1943 when he was posted to North Africa with the 1st Army and fought in Italy, France and Germany. He was discharged as a Lance Corporal in 1946.

Frank Lonsdale of Lytham St Annes, Lancashire died on 5th May 2015, aged 76. He was called up for National Service in 1958 and joined the Royal Armoured Corps, training at Catterick with the Scots Greys after which he transferred to the Queens Royal Lancers, serving as a driving and maintenance instructor. He was posted to Osnabruck before discharge in 1960.

Peter Marks of Uckfield died on 25th April 2015, aged 84. He joined the Royal Signals in 1951 and following service in the UK was discharged as a Lance Corporal in 1957.

Thomas McDermott of Streatham, London died on 22nd April 2015, aged 95. He joined the Cameronians (Scottish Rifles) in 1940. He fought in the Middle East, Sicily, Italy and was later in France before advancing to Germany. He was

crossing the Rhine when the war ended, meeting up with the Russians. He was discharged in 1946 as a Rifleman.

Leonard Misselbrook of Hornchurch, Essex died on 23rd April 2015, aged 90. He joined the Royal Navy in 1943 serving on the Atlantic and Arctic Convoys as well as providing support for D-Day. He was discharged as an Able Seaman in 1947.

Jozef Munko of Solihull, West Midlands died on 2nd April 2015, aged 95. He joined the Polish Army in 1940 after the Germans invaded and was captured but subsequently escaped only to be recaptured by the Russians and sent to a gulag. When Russia joined the war on the side of the allies he was repatriated to the UK following a prisoner exchange. From 1942, he served under British Command in Libya at Tobruk and Bardiyah and later in Italy at Ancona, Bologna, Monte Cassino. He was discharged as a Lance Corporal in 1948.

Raymond Nash of Radstock, Somerset died on 16th April 2015, aged 92. He joined the Royal Air Force in 1942 and served initially as a clerk at RAF Colerne. He moved to West Kirkby and then went from Glasgow to board a troopship bound for India via Cape Town. He served in India for the rest of the war and was demobilised in 1946 as a Sergeant.

Thomas 'Tom' Parkinson of Preston, Lancashire died on 2nd May 2015, aged 95. He joined the Royal Air Force in 1940 and following training at RAF Padgate and RAF Grantham specialised as a motor mechanic. He was posted to North Africa, Sardinia and Italy. He was discharged as a Leading Aircraftman in 1946.

Joseph Randle of Barnsley, South Yorkshire died on 19th March 2015, aged 79. He joined the Royal Artillery in 1954 and after training in Owestry he joined the 77 Ack Ack Regiment as a Predictor. Posted to a camp near Bremen, Germany he remained there until discharge in 1956. He then completed three years Colours Service and was discharged in 1959.

Brian Robey of Spennymoor, County Durham died on 24th April 2015, aged 69. He joined the Royal Signals in 1969 and after service in Germany and Singapore he was discharged as a Signaller in 1973.

Alistair Reid of Banstead, Surrey died on 11th May 2015, aged 85. He began his National Service in 1955 in the Border Regiment. He successfully completed WOSB at Andover and was commissioned into the Border Regiment. He carried out his officers training at Eaton Hall before being transferred to the West

African Frontier Force and was based in Karduna. He returned to the UK and was seconded to the mobile Defence Corps. He was discharged in 1961 as a Lieutenant.

Edwin 'Eddie' Robins of Cheltenham, Gloucestershire died on 1st March 2015, aged 91. He joined the Royal Air Force in 1956 and served as a flight mechanic in the UK on York Transport Aircraft. He was discharged as a Leading Aircraftman in 1948.

Stanley Romaine of Rainham, Essex died on 8th April 2015, aged 87. He joined the General Service Corps in 1946 and a few months later transferred to the Essex Regiment before joining the Army Catering Corps in 1947. He served in the UK and India and was demobilised in 1948.

Linda Sanders of Uckfield, East Sussex died on 2nd April 2015, aged 94. She joined the Auxiliary Territorial Service in 1941 and trained in Guildford. Posted to Chislehurst as a teleprinter operator she was then attached to Ack-Ack in Uxbridge with the RAF. From a posting at Bulford, Wiltshire she was released to the reserve in 1946.

John Scott of Hebburn, Tyne and Wear died on 19th April 2015, aged 101. He joined the Royal Navy in 1940 and following training in Fife joined the Fleet Air Arm. He served in HMS Formidable in the Indian Ocean, involved in operations off Burma. He then served in the Mediterranean supporting the North Africa and Italian campaigns and later joined HMS Deersound, a supply ship in the Pacific. He was discharged as a Temporary Acting Leading Hand in 1946.

David Smith of Corby, Northamptonshire died on 15th April 2015, aged 94. He joined the Royal Air Force in 1941, qualified as a radio engineer and flew in Liberators. He served in India and Burma and was discharged as a Warrant Officer in 1946.

Raymond 'Ray' Snowden of Dereham, Norfolk died on 14th April 2015, aged 92. He joined the Royal Air Force in 1941 and specialised as a wireless operator, flying in Lancaster and USAF B24 transport planes. He was based in the UK and flew on decoy flights before discharge as a Warrant Officer in 1946.

Patricia 'Pat' Thompson of Burgess Hill, West Sussex died on 17th April 2015, aged 92. She served in the Women's Royal Naval Service from 1942 to 1946 onboard HMS Drake in Devonport and HMS Excellent in Portsmouth.

Arthur Walton of Newhaven, East Sussex died on 15th April 2015, aged 94. He began his training at Hilsea Barracks, Portsmouth in 1941 before joining the Royal Army Ordnance Corps where he specialised in supply and stores. He later trained as a bomb disposal officer and had a series of postings around the UK. Serving at Bicester and finally Aldershot, he was demobilised as a Sergeant in 1946. A regular in the Art & Craft Workshop at the Brighton centre he was well known for the highly recognisable figures that he created.

Reginald 'Reg' Warner of Dereham, Norfolk died on 7th April 2015, aged 94. He joined the Middlesex Regiment in 1939 and after training at Mill Hill he was deployed to France with the BEF and evacuated from Dunkirk. He spent some time back in Felixstowe prior to being posted to the Western Desert as part of the 8th Army in 1943 with the 51st Highland Division. He later landed in Sicily, then returned to the UK and subsequently landed in Normandy on D+3. He transferred to the Royal Army Service Corps in 1945 as a driver and was discharged in 1946.

James Whiting of Accrington, Lancashire died on 3rd April 2015, aged 95. He joined the Royal Navy in 1936 and served on Atlantic Convoys, the North Sea, the Mediterranean and the Far East. He was discharged as an Electrical Mechanic 1st Class in 1949.

William 'Bill' Williams of Machynlleth, Powys died on 1st April 2015, aged 83. He began his National Service in 1950 and after training as a driver was posted to Hong Kong and transferred to a Searchlight Unit, patrolling the border area between Hong Kong and China. He signed on for regular service, remaining in the Royal Artillery and serving in the UK until he was discharged as an Acting Sergeant in 1959.

John Wood of Ashford, Kent died on 22nd April 2015, aged 91. He joined the General Service Corps in February 1943 and transferred to the Royal Army Ordnance Corps two months later, serving in the UK, Egypt and Palestine until 1946 when he was demobilised as a Private.

Millicent Woodgate of Exeter, Devon died on 28th April 2015, aged 95. She joined the Royal Army Pay Corps in 1941 and served in Exeter. She was discharged in 1945 as a Private.


I am delighted to confirm that your application to attend our very special Centenary Garden Party on Thursday 4th June has been successful.
